- ⇒ <u>8:46am</u>: American Airlines Flight 11, flying from Boston to Los Angeles with 92 people on board, crashes into the north tower of the World Trade Center in New York City.
- \Rightarrow <u>8:47am</u>: Firefighters and emergency crews begin heading for the Trade Center.
- ⇒ <u>9:02am</u>: United Airlines flight 175, flying from Boston to Los Angeles with 65 people on board, crashes into the south tower of the World Trade Center.
- ⇒ <u>9:30am</u>: From Florida, President George W. Bush announces the country has suffered an "apparent terrorist attack," and pledges that the US will hunt down the responsible parties.
- ⇒ <u>9:38am</u>: American Airlines flight 77, flying from Dulles Airport in Washington, D.C. to Los Angeles with 64 people on board, crashes into the Pentagon, in northern Virginia, and explodes into flames.
- ⇒ <u>9:58am</u>: The south tower of the World Trade Center collapses. An emergency operator in Pennsylvania receives a call from a passenger on United Airlines flight 93, flying from Newark to San Francisco with 45 people aboard, stating the plane is being hijacked.
- ⇒ <u>10:10am</u>: Damage from the plane crash causes part of the Pentagon to collapse. United Airlines flight 93 crashes to the ground in Somerset County, Pennsylvania, south east of Pittsburgh, heroically brought down by its own passengers after hearing about the attacks on the World Trade Center. Officials later speculate that the plane's hijackers had intended to attack the White House or the Capitol.
- ⇒ 10:28am: The north tower of the World Trade Center collapses.
- ⇒ <u>11:02am</u>: New York mayor Rudolph Giuliani orders Lower Manhattan to be evacuated.
- ⇒ <u>1:04pm</u>: President Bush states that the nation is taking appropriate security measures. He asks Americans to pray for the victims of the attacks and says America "will hunt down and punish those responsible for these cowardly acts."
- \Rightarrow <u>4:00pm</u>: U.S. officials say there are "good indications" that Saudi terrorist Osama bin Laden, who is suspected of coordinating the bombings of two U.S. embassies in Africa in 1998, is behind the attacks.
- ⇒ <u>6:10pm</u>: Mayor Giuliani urges New Yorkers to stay at home on the next day
- ⇒ <u>7:45pm</u>: New York's police department announces that at least 78 of its officers are missing. The city also announces that hundreds of firefighters have been killed.
- ⇒ <u>8:31pm</u>: In a televised address, President Bush says, "thousands of lives were suddenly ended by evil" and asks Americans to pray for the victims and their families. The president announces the U.S. government will not differentiate between terrorists and those who harbor them.
