1 ANDERSONVILLE

Berwyn 22

Anchored by the Swedish American Museum, this tight-knit enclave is rooted in its historic identity, but also recognized for its diversity as home to one of the city's largest LGBTQ communities. With its small-town charm and long-standing businesses, it's a place where well-crafted beer and handcrafted gifts go hand in hand. Step into inviting cafes along Clark Street, tour the local distillery, or go bargain hunting for urban antiques and vintage finds.



2 BRIDGEPORT

24, 62 Sox-35th Halsted

The birthplace of five Chicago mayors, and home to the Chicago White Sox, this working-class South Side neighborhood has blossomed into a diverse community that packs plenty of local color. Contemporary art centers are thriving along with new restaurants, juxtaposed with neighborhood mainstays like the corner taverns and historic churches.



3 BRONZEVILLE

35th-Bronzeville-IIT, 43rd, 47th 3, 4, 29

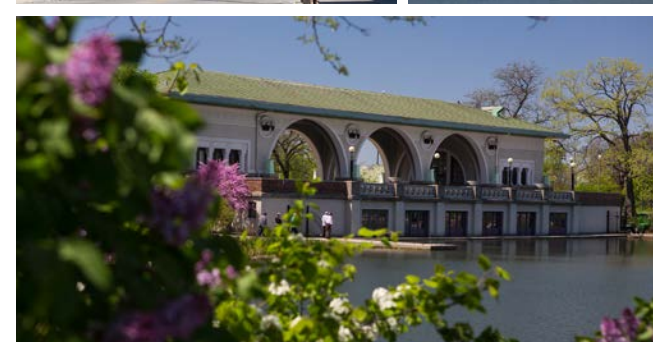
Bronzeville is a prominent African American neighborhood filled with historic, architectural and public art treasures around every corner. From the legacy of the Great Migration to the world renowned buildings by architect Mies van der Rohe, see why this South Side community is a must-see.



5 HUMBOLDT PARK

Division followed by 70

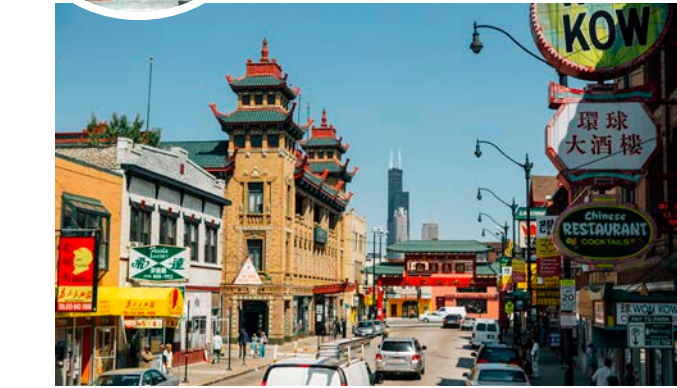
Humboldt Park is rooted in a proud Hispanic tradition. With buildings splashed with vibrant murals and air that smells of *lechon* and *carne guisada*, Humboldt Park is a slice of the Caribbean amid Chicago's colorful city streets. Connected to the namesake park, the area's cultural epicenter — known as "Paseo Boricua" — bursts with authentic Puerto Rican cuisine, specialty shopping and the National Museum of Puerto Rican Arts & Culture.



4 CHINATOWN

Cermak-Chinatown 24, 62 Water taxi (seasonal)

Chicago's Chinatown is one of the largest neighborhoods of its kind in the United States. The vibrant and energetic culture is reflected in the area's many specialty shops, authentic cuisine and signature landmarks.



6 HYDE PARK

Metra 51st-53rd Street, 55th-56th-57th Street 4, 6, 10 (weekends)

Hyde Park has it all: a beautiful lakefront, architectural marvels, great dining and culture galore with a collection of seven institutions making up Museum Campus South. Come see why President Obama decided to call this neighborhood home.



7 LAKEVIEW/BOYSTOWN/WRIGLEYVILLE

Addison, Belmont 8, 22, 36, 151, 152 Western, Damen, Montrose, Rockwell



Lakeview is one of Chicago's liveliest neighborhoods. Several distinct areas — East Lakeview, Boystown and Wrigleyville, home to Wrigley Field and the Chicago Cubs — meld together to form a lakefront community that celebrates diversity and boasts something for every type of visitor.



8 LINCOLN PARK

Charming, tree-lined Lincoln Park is home to Lincoln Park Zoo, landmark districts, peaceful parks and beaches, and bustling business corridors featuring trendy boutiques and award-winning restaurants. The community features diverse arts and entertainment options as well with a plethora of museums, top theaters and live music clubs to pick from.

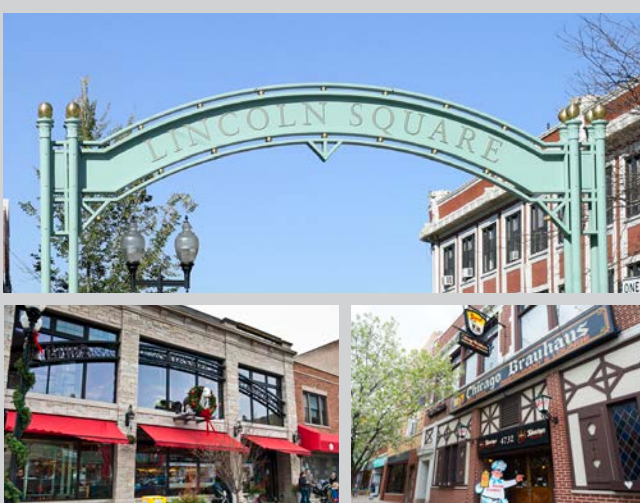
Fullerton, North/Clybourn Armitage, Fullerton 22, 36, 151



9 LINCOLN SQUARE

Western, Damen, Montrose, Rockwell

Old World heritage meets modern charm in this traditionally German neighborhood. Lincoln Square maintains its roots with historic shops and restaurants while offering a new array of hip restaurants, bars and boutiques.



10 LOGAN SQUARE

California, Logan Square, Western 56

Cheap eats, buzz-worthy restaurants, and bike-friendly streets. Gourmet coffee, craft beer, and incredible cocktails. All among an expansive system of interconnected parks and streetscapes dotted with beautifully-restored mansions, handsome greystone homes and majestic churches. This is the recipe for Chicago's hipster haven.



11 PILSEN

18th, Damen 60

Culture is around every corner in Pilsen, visible through its bold murals (don't miss the seemingly-endless stretch on 16th Street) and the colorful collections of the National Museum of Mexican Art. The budding dining scene boasts both authentic taquerias and Michelin-starred restaurants, whereas vintage shopping and storefront galleries and studios are the highlight along 18th and Halsted Streets.



13 WEST TOWN

Grand, Chicago 66

For a sense of Chicago's working class spirit — injected by an indie cool, creative energy — make your way to the eclectic cross-section of West Town, Ukrainian Village and East Village. Colorful galleries, shops and museums, and small-scale music venues and theaters, can still feel off-the-beaten path amid historic churches,



12 UPTOWN

Wilson, Lawrence, Argyle 36

A vibrant blend of old and new, Uptown is an intriguing neighborhood where Chicago's rich history and ethnic diversity intersect. Asian cuisine anchors Argyle Street: noodles, *pho*, *bánh mì* and more. For live music and nightlife, sit back with jazz at the Green Mill, a 100-year-old classic, or discover up-and-coming artists in rock, hip hop, electronic and alternative at the Riviera Theatre or Aragon Ballroom.



14 WICKER PARK/BUCKTOWN

Division, Damen, Western 56

Synonymous neighborhoods Wicker Park and Bucktown lie just outside downtown; traverse The 606 for a local's perspective (the elevated park trail connects several 'hoods). Hip hotspots center around the North/Damen/Milwaukee intersection and along Division Street: hubs known for live music and nightlife, chef-driven restaurants, and studio galleries. Between the craft cocktails bars and coffee shops, thrift stores and luxury boutiques, there's no better area to sip and shop.

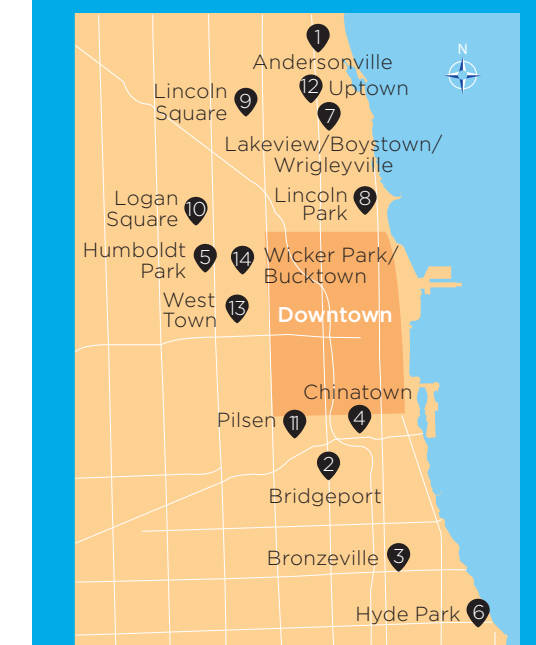

TRANSPORTATION

GETTING AROUND ON THE CTA

The Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) serves the city of Chicago and 35 neighboring communities by rail and bus. Pay cash (bus only) for single trip ride, or purchase a reloadable fare card at any rail station. For more information, visit transitchicago.com.

METRA RAIL

The high-speed Metra commuter rail connects outlying suburbs to downtown. For more information, visit metrarail.com.

GRAB A BIKE

Chicago's Divvy bike-sharing program is an inexpensive and easy way to get around. Thousands of bikes are available at hundreds of stations across the city. For more information, visit divvybikes.com.

GETTING TO AND FROM CHICAGO'S AIRPORTS

FROM O'HARE: Blue Line CTA trains arrive downtown in about 45 minutes. Trains depart from the CTA station inside the airport's Terminal 3 (T3). Reach this CTA station via pedestrian tunnels from Terminals 1, 2 and 3. From Terminal 5, take the Airport Transit System (ATS) to Terminal 3 then follow the signs. Purchase a fare card from the fare vending machine - the turnstiles do not accept cash at this station.

FROM MIDWAY: Orange Line trains arrive downtown in about 45 minutes. Trains depart from the CTA station connected to the airport's east side. Follow "Trains to the City" signs. Purchase a fare card from the fare vending machine - the turnstiles do not accept cash at this station.
